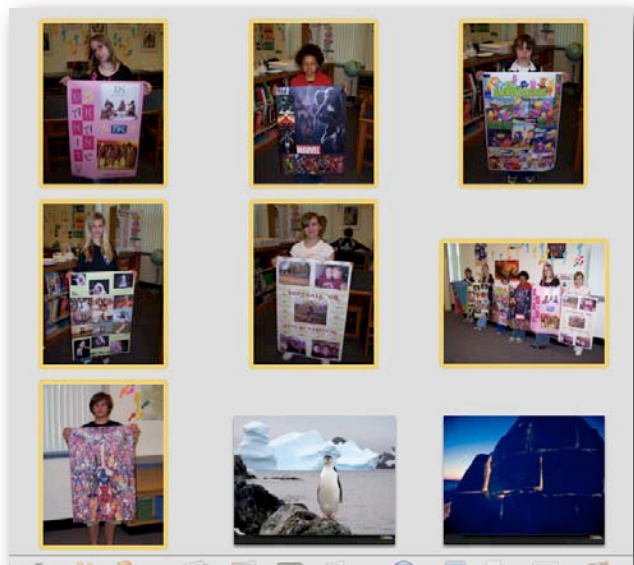


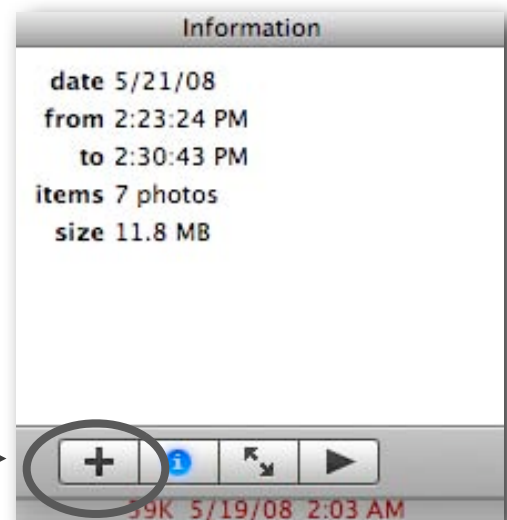
Making a Quick Movie from an iPhoto Slide Show iPhoto '09

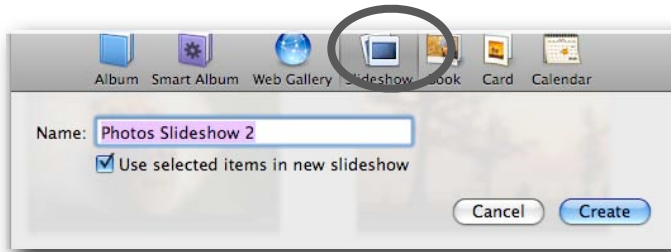
1. Launch iPhoto and in the bar on the left click on "Photos" to see all your Photos. (If you have created photo Events by adding a set of downloaded pictures, you may click on "Events" instead, to choose an entire event to work with.)



2. Hold down the "Command" (Apple) key and click on just the pictures you want to include in the slide show.

3. Now click on the "plus" sign at the bottom of the bar on the left.





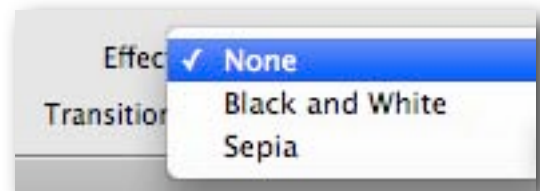
4. Click on "Slideshow" and enter a name in the Name field. Make sure "Use selected items ..." is checked. Click "Create."



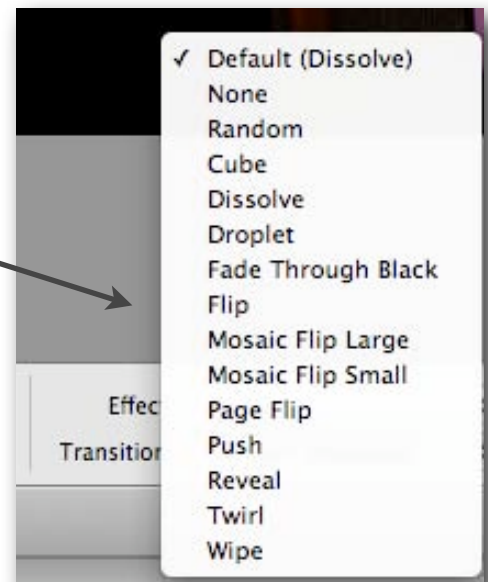
5. A slideshow will be created, made up of the selected photos. It will show up on your left side bar in the "Slideshows" section towards the bottom.

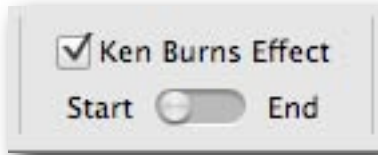
6. The basic slideshow is now created. Time to play with the tools at the bottom of your screen.

"Effects" gives you a few color choices for your photos.



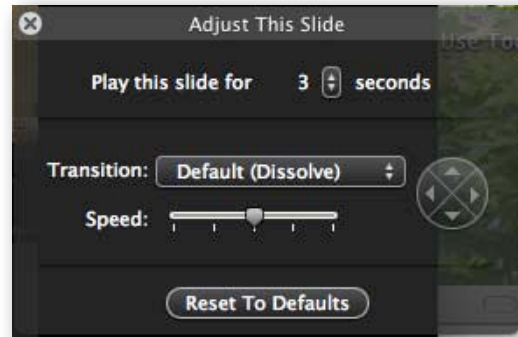
7. "Transitions" allows you to choose the way each slide moves to the next one.



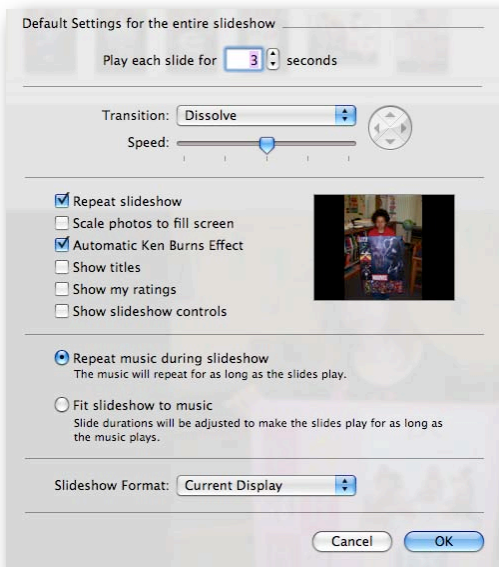


8. The "Ken Burns Effect" refers to a movement in and out on a particular picture.

9. "Adjust This Slide" gives you even more control on each slide.



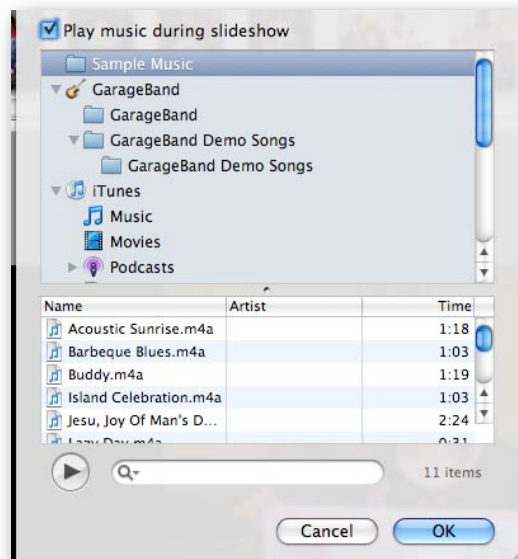
10. "Settings" expands your choices for the slideshow as a whole - should it repeat? How will the music work with it? How long should each slide stay on the screen before it switches to the next?



11. Choose a music file for your slideshow - from iTunes or GarageBand.

Or choose a file from freeplaymusic.com if you prefer.

To prevent copyright problems, either record the song in GarageBand and then use it ... or burn onto a CD, then take from the CD to use in the slideshow.



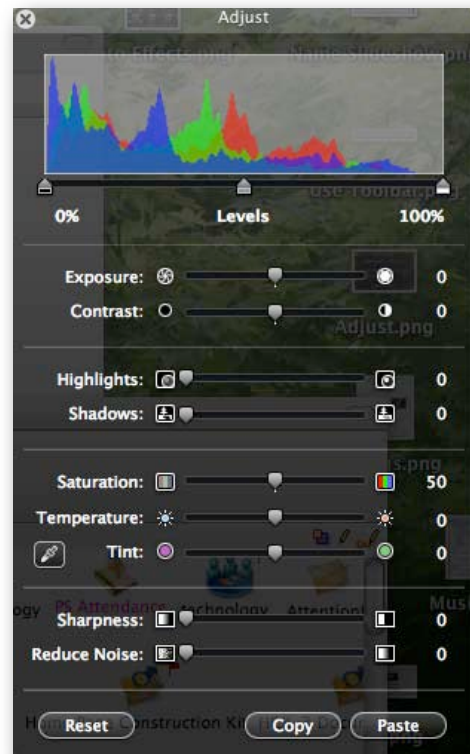
Editing Photos

12. To further edit a photo in the show (crop, retouch, etc.), double-click on the photo itself. This will bring up a whole new toolbar on the bottom, which you can use to adjust the photo.



"Effects" gives you choices of color and masking.

"Adjust" lets you modify the color and exposure of the photo.

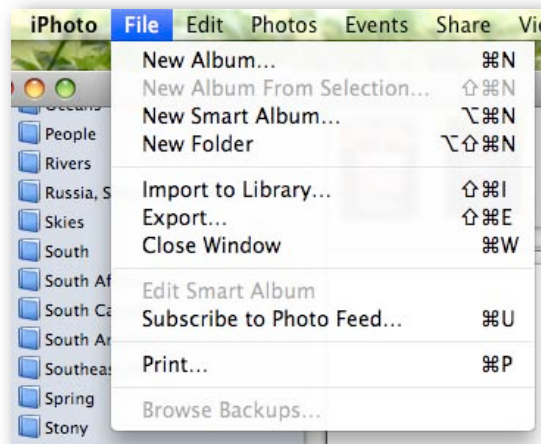


Saving Your Slideshow as a Movie and Posting it on Your Website

Click on "Play" and "Preview" to view your slideshow. Once it's ready, you can export it as a small movie file, which you can post on your website.

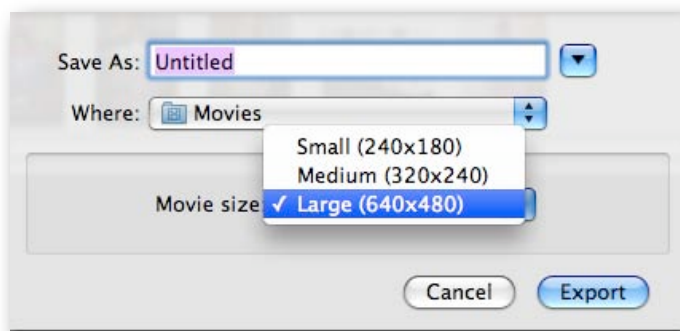


1. To begin, click on the name of the slideshow in the bar to the left. Then from the "File" menu, choose "Export."



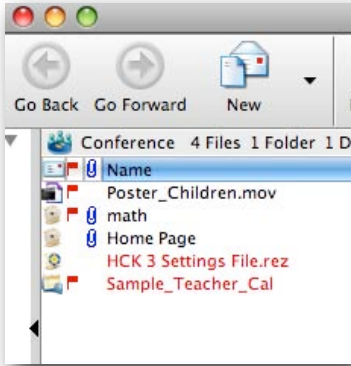
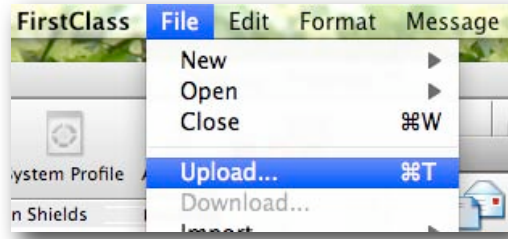
2. From the menu that appears, choose the size you prefer and name your project.

By default, your movie file will be saved to your "Movies" folder unless you choose a different location. Click on "Export."



3. Log into First Class and open your web conference (your website folder). From the "File" menu, choose "Upload."

Your movie will appear as a ".mov" file in your conference.



4. Open the web page you wish to attach the movie to. Type in the name of the file in the link path.
